Thank you for subscribing to Around the Green, which is produced by the Parish Council for the residents of Newton. In this edition, we have the following updates for you:

Project to upgrade Newton's Walking Infrastructure including a pedestrian crossing

Suffolk Highways are now calculating the indicative costs of improving the walking infrastructure in Newton. The project includes a new footpath on the Green from School Lane to the Golf Club road, a move of the bus shelter on the Green, the widening of the existing footpath between Church Road and Links View and a signalised pedestrian crossing. They are currently finalising the costs for the crossing and will then give the councillors the total that needs to be raised. NPC will then approach organisations for contributions towards the funding.

Newton Neighbourhood Plan

The councillors have set aside some of its CIL receipts, received from the development of new dwellings in the village, for the first phase of the review of the Newton Neighbourhood Plan. With no Government grants available for the review, and no other funding available from other areas, the councillors have engaged a consultant to help guide the Working Group through the initial tasks. With resident meetings being planned for the New Year, to explain why the council consider the review is so important for Newton, please keep a look out for further news on this.
